Breaux Bridge Elementary School Parental and Family Engagement Policy

School Mission Statement: Breaux Bridge Elementary will prepare students by educating the whole child. We will encourage students to adapt the skills, knowledge, attitude, and tenacity needed to meet high expectations and conquer challenges that may come their way.

School Vision Statement: Breaux Bridge Elementary strives to prepare tomorrow's adults by making a positive impact on them today.

The St. Martin Parish School Board recognizes that parental involvement is the key to academic achievement. The term parent refers to any caregiver who assumes responsibility for nurturing and caring for children, including parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, foster parents, step-parents, etc. Studies demonstrate that when parents are involved in their children's education, the attitudes, behaviors, and achievement of students are positively enhanced.
